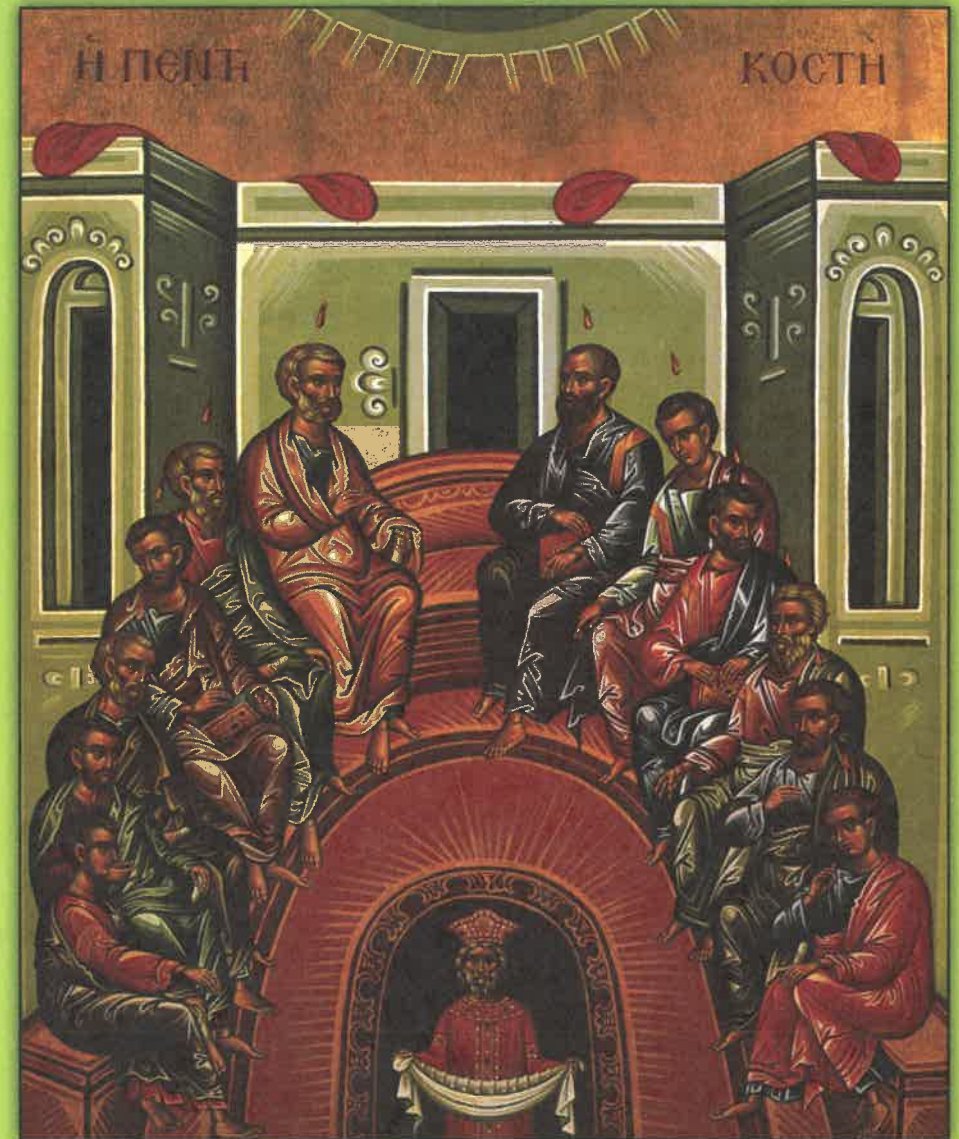
tures that share in Him He gives a delight limited only by their own nature, not by His ability to give.

PENTECOST MONDAY

The feast in honor of the Holy Spirit, "one of the Trinity of God, one in honor, one in essence and one in glory with the Father and the Son" is celebrated on the Monday after Pentecost. This feast has been established by the Church "for the majesty of the Most Holy and Life-creating Spirit, for He is one of the Holy and Life-originating Trinity", in reaction to the teaching of the heretics who rejected the divinity of the Holy Spirit and that He is equal-in-honor with God the Father and the God the Son. "The Holy Spirit", as it says in the Synaxarion, "is called the Comforter because He can encourage and calm us; we received Him "in place of Christ" and through Christ we have Him; He intercedes before God for us with unspeakable sighs as the Lover of mankind, interceding for us in exactly the same way as Christ, for He is the Comforter. Therefore the Holy Spirit is called the other Comforter; wherefore the Apostle says: we have the Comforter Jesus before God. This Holy Spirit is one with the Father and the Son in everything; He therefore accomplishes everything with Them, even the future resurrection, and everything that He wants, He creates, sanctifies, divides, renews, sends, makes wise, anoints the prophets, and briefly to say: does everything, being all-powerful, omnipotent, good, correct, and reigning. Through him is granted every wisdom, life, activity, as He is the source of sanctification and all life. Join us for the Pentecost Monday Holyday Liturgy, June 6th at 6:00 p.m.



The color Green for Pentecost in our Church



Among the Ruthenian people, Pentecost Sunday is also called **RUSALJA** or **GREEN SUNDAY**. Coming as it does during the late spring or early summer the feast of Pentecost is connected in folk customs with new life, new growth, and as such is celebrated with the symbol of new life, the color green. Just as the earth comes to life after the long death of winter by sprouting forth shoots of green, so too our life in the Church is renewed at this time of year. In the old country, the little and great churches are decorated with green and greenery in every way imaginable. This preponderance of green and new green shoots and branches serves to remind us that our faith life is to be ever vigorous, ever renewed and that the Holy Spirit does indeed invigorate us with life. Linden (lipa) branches were predominately used. The Trinitarian aspect of the feast remind us that all our prayers are offered to the Father, through the Son.

No penitential practice this Friday

During this Pentecost Week, our Byzantine Catholic Church proscribes NO fasting or abstinence. This is in joyful celebration of the Most Holy Spirit. **This Friday, June 10th** is a "free Friday" from any penance or fasting. Enjoy meat!

Christian Upbringing

When Christian upbringing is central to a family's understating of itself as "a little Church," children are more likely to retain their parent's religion when they grow up as adults.

--Among those who grew up Catholic, if religion was important to their family growing up, 73% identify as Catholics today; but if religion was not important, that number drops to 38%. The corresponding numbers for Protestant families are 89% and 67% respectively.

--Among Americans who were raised either by a single parent who had no religious affiliation or by two "nones," 67% identify as "nones" today. When one parent was religiously affiliated but the other was unaffiliated, the percentage drops to 38.
