Lighting Our Lamp

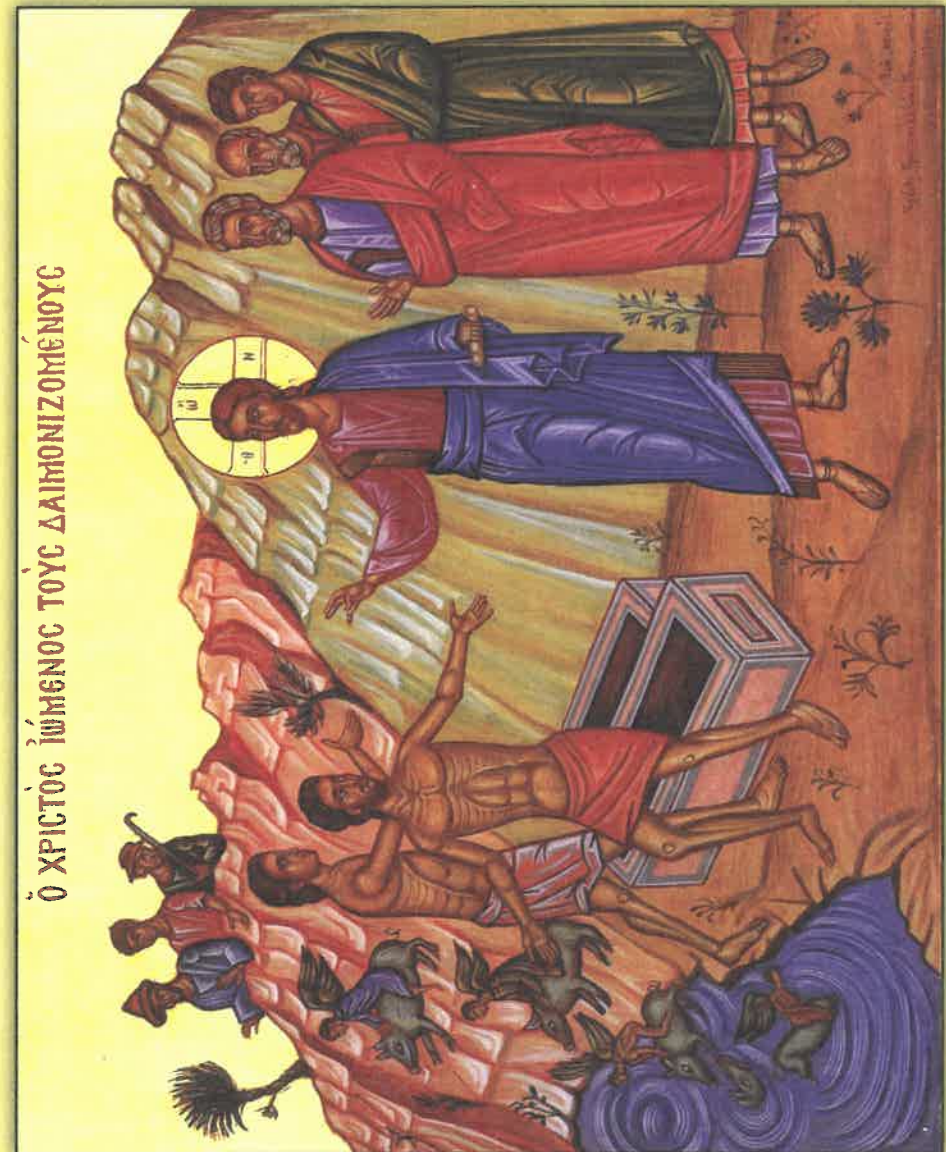
God is fire and He is so called by all the inspired Scripture (cf Heb 12:29). The soul of each of us is a lamp. Now a lamp is wholly in darkness, even though it be filled with oil or tow or other combustible matter, until it receives fire and is kindled. So too the soul, though it may seem to be adorned with all virtues, yet does not receive the fire – in other words, has not received the divine nature and light – and is still unkindled and dark and its works are uncertain. All things must be tested and manifested by the light (cf. Eph 5:13). The man whose soul's lamp is still in darkness, that is, untouched by the divine fire, stands the more in need of a guide with a shining torch, who will discern his actions. As he has compassion for the faults

he reveals in confession he will straightway straighten out whatever is crooked in his actions. Just as he who walks in the night cannot avoid stumbling, so he who has not yet seen the divine light cannot avoid falling into sin. As Christ says, "If anyone walks in the day, he does not stumble, because he sees this light. But if anyone walks in the night, he stumbles, because he has not the light in him" (Jn 11:9-10). When He said "in him," he meant the divine and immaterial light, for no one can possess the physical light in himself.

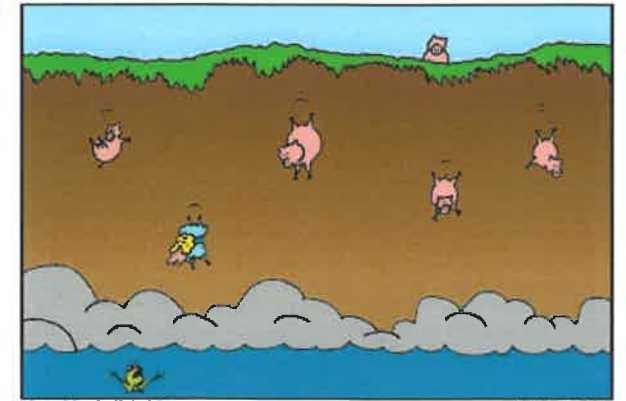

Fifth Sunday after Pentecost

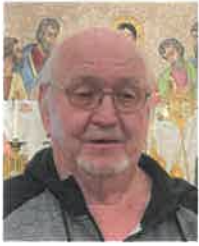
On this Sunday we hear of Our Lord Jesus Christ's encounter with the two demon possessed men in the countryside of the Gergesenes. We do not know why these men are possessed by demons. We only know the results of the possession. We see their anger with God and their fellow man in the words of the Gospel, saying, "Coming out from the tombs, exceedingly fierce, so that no one could pass that way" (Matthew 8:28).

Saint Nikolaj Velimirovič observes that "Men work unrighteousness against God and so they are angry with God." All too often, people will sin against God or their fellow man and blame God for the consequences of their actions. All sin is rooted in the inappropriate use of our self-will. When we sin, we either place ourselves above God or above our fellow man. In doing so, we are out of harmony with God and creation. In the worst cases of a sinful life, the person becomes so out of harmony with God and creation no one wants to be near that person; or, to use the words of the Gospel, they become "exceedingly fierce."

Continuing with the commentary on this Gospel, Saint Nikolaj Velimirovič points out, that that the demons never mention the men when they say, "If you cast us out, suffer us to go away into the herd of swine," (Matthew 8:31) because the men are dead to the demons. The venerable bishop of Ziča goes on to say, "They did not want to leave the man; they would have infinitely rather have stayed in him then go into the swine.... While the demons can make men like swine, and far worse than swine, what can they make of swine? They will, through the swine, go on doing man harm; if in no other way then by drowning the swine and provoking men's fury against God."

The result of casting out of these demons is that the town's people see the two men in their right minds healed and their swine destroyed. They cannot see the miracle that just happened. All they can see is the destruction of the swine. They do not see how much God valued these men or any man. On this Sunday, let us be reminded of the fact know that we are under attack by the demons that wish to drag you down with them into the abyss of hell, which they created for themselves; know that you can create this same hell for yourself; and know that God is there to save you from the abyss of hell because you are the crown of His creation, created in His image and likeness.
