## Loving Our Enemies

Those who close their eyes to the demands of love fall asleep in the desire for worldly pleasures. Therefore, be watchful. Eating, drinking, carousing, gambling, and hunting are pleasures, but evils of every kind follow in the wake of these vanities. No one can deny that they are enjoyable, but love of God's law must come first, for to love God means to keep His commandments. Which commandments? You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, and you must love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

My brothers and sisters, to widen our hearts, we need not depend upon ourselves. Ask God to help you love one another – to love everyone without exception, not just your friends, but enemies as well; not because they are your brothers and sisters in Christ, but so that they may be. Pray that you may

always have a warm, fraternal love for other people, both for those who have become your brothers and sisters, and for your enemies, that they may become such. Whenever you love brothers or sisters you love friends, for they are already with you, joined to you in faith unity. If they live virtuously you love them as people who have been changed from enemies into brothers and sisters. But suppose you love people who do not yet believe in Christ, or if they do, yet believe as the devil believes – they believe in Christ, but still no do not love him. You must love just the same, you must love even people like that, you must love them as brothers and sisters. They are not such yet, but you must love them so that they may become such through your kindness. All our love, then, must be fraternal.

## A Message From Our Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

In his epistle, St. James states: *“Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the priests of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven”* {James 14-15}.

This brief letter is to state my pastoral policy when it comes to sacramental visitations or informing me if you would like a call or visit when ill or homebound. Even though I currently administer two parishes and serve as Archieparchial Vocation Director, I will always try my best to make a sacramental visit or anything else I can do for one who is sick, shut-in, or needs pastoral care.

When requesting a pastoral visit or even a phone call, it is the responsibility of the individual, a family member, or caregiver of that individual to let me know. Only then, I will visit, whether that’s in the hospital, an institution, or at home. Due to privacy acts (namely, HIPPA) and still along with Covid concerns some people have, I will not make a sacramental call or visitation by “hearing through the grapevine” about a person who wants me to visit or call. I received an insolent text message recently about this very fact.

Sometimes, I find out weeks or months later a parishioner was sick or in recovery somewhere, and then get asked, why didn’t I visit them or at least call. How am I suppose to know that if that person or family does not tell me? You may get ahold of me many ways. The parish office phone, my personal cell phone, my email, our parish facebook page and website are all ways to reach me. If you would like to even set up monthly sacramental visits, you may schedule that as well, if physically you cannot attend church.

Furthermore, if you are having surgery or have been sick awhile, you may request Anointing of the Sick. Remember, anointing is for healing, physically and more importantly, spiritually. It does not mean that death is at the door. It’s meant to prepare us for God’s will, whatever that may be.

If you have any further questions or concerns, you may see me. Let us all remember to pray for those who are sick, ill, or shut-in, and through all of our prayers, may God bestow strength and healing.
