## Jesus, the Lord of Life

How do you respond to the misfortunes of others? In a number of places the gospel records that Jesus was “moved to the depths of His heart.” Our English word “compassion” is a weak translation of the Hebrew word for “sympathy.”

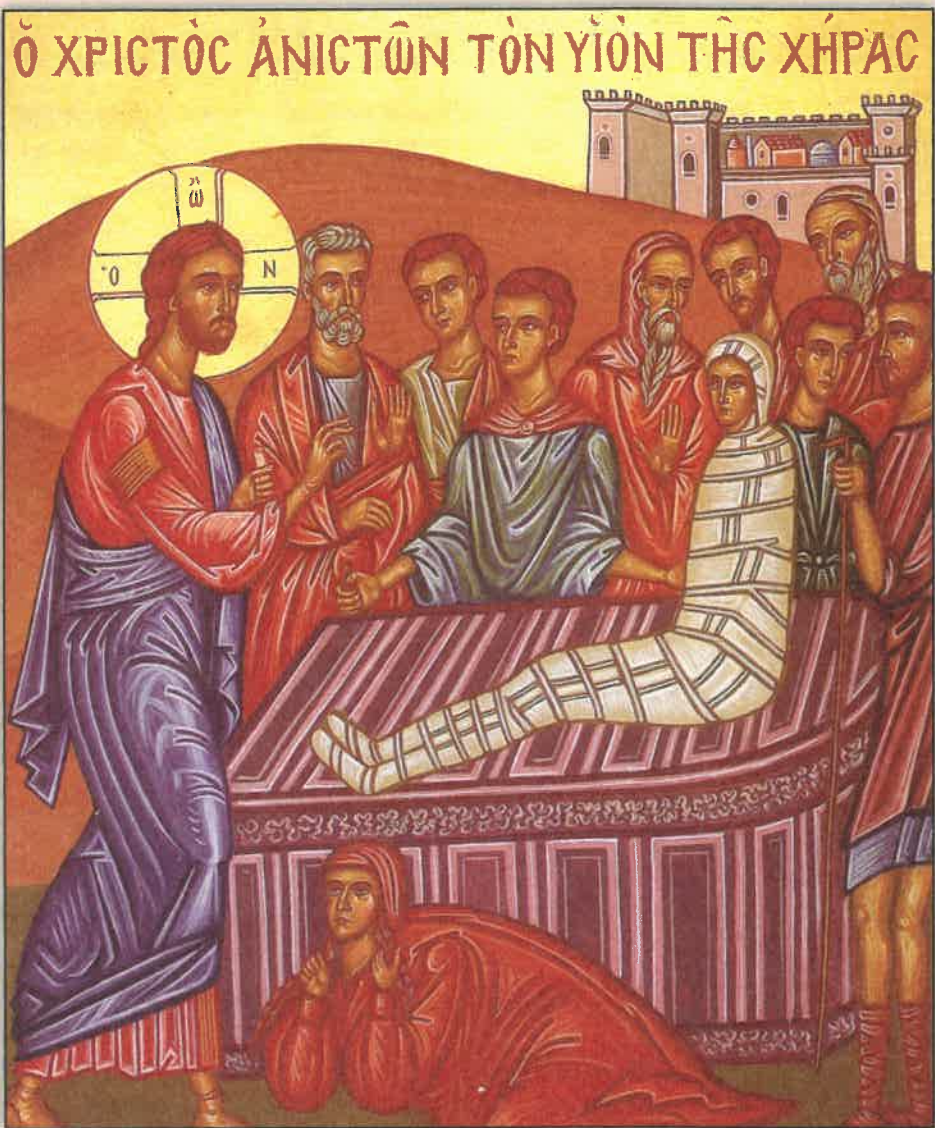
Why was Jesus so moved on this occasion? Jesus not only grieved the untimely death of a youth, but he showed the depth of his concern for a woman who lost not only a husband, but an only child as well. The scriptures make clear that God takes no pleasure in the death of anyone (e.g., Ezekiel 33:11); God desires life, not death. Jesus not only had compassion, He also had power – the ability to restore life and make whole again. Jesus, however, incurred grave risk by approaching the bier, since contact with a

dead body made one ritually impure. His touch not only restored life but brought freedom and wholeness to soul as well as body.

This miracle is reminiscent of the prophet Eli-sha who raised another mother's son (see 2 Kings 4:18-37). Jesus claimed as His own one whom death had seized as its prey. By His word of power He restored life for a young man marked for death. Jesus is Lord not only of the living but of the dead as well. Jesus triumphed over the grave and He promises that because He lives, we also shall live in Him (John 14:19). Do you trust in the Lord's power to give life and hope in the face of misfortune and despair?

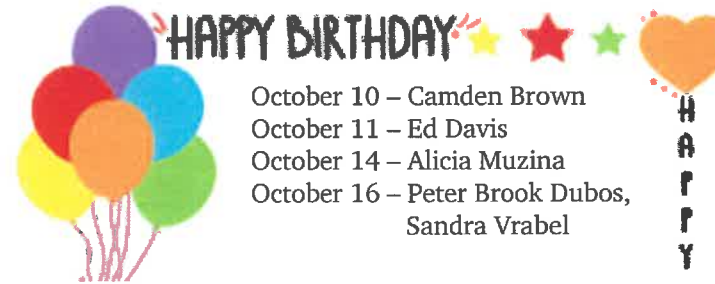

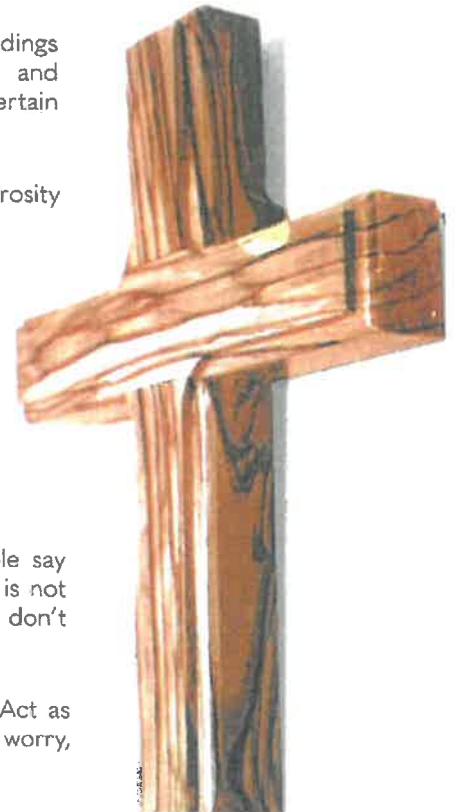

# Good Christian:

- 1 Bite your tongue. Always say less than you in fact think. Speak in a quiet but convincing voice. It not only depends on what you say, but also how you say it.
- 2 Promise infrequently, but keep your promises faithfully, no matter what it costs you.
- 3 Don't miss the opportunity to tell someone something kind and encouraging.
- 4 Take an interest in others, their lives, work, home and family. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Let everyone whom you meet, though they may be humble, feel that you consider them an important person.
- 5 Always be happy, cheerful. Do not burden or taint your surroundings with small everyday pain, difficulties, failures, suffering and disappointments. Remember: everyone carries with them a certain burden.
- 6 Be unbiased. Discuss but do not discourage. It is a sign of generosity if you disagree without being annoying.
- 7 Refuse to talk about the other person's mistakes. Let your virtues, if you have them, speak for themselves. Do not support gossip. It is a waste of precious time and it can be extremely malignant.
- 8 Respect the feelings of others. Joking and joking on someone else's account are rarely appropriate and they can hurt someone when we least expect it.
- 9 Ignore annoying remarks about you and anything that people say about you. Remember that if the person speaking about you is not speaking the truth then it does not accurately reflect you, so don't let it worry you.
- 10 Don't be too anxious and frightened about your reputation. Act as you know best and be patient. Forget about yourself and don't worry, if you do good things then people will notice.

Pastor Appreciation Day began with the establishment of Clergy Appreciation Month. In Timothy 1 (5:17), St. Paul began the concept of clergy appreciation when he stated that the elders of the church are worthy of a double honor. He reiterated this idea in Thessalonians 1 (5: 12-13) when he stated that those who work hard among you should be held in the highest regard for their work. This idea became Clergy Appreciation Month in 1992, established by pastors and religious workers. Eventually, Pastor Appreciation Day would form out of the second Sunday in October.

## Trick or Treat Campbell hours

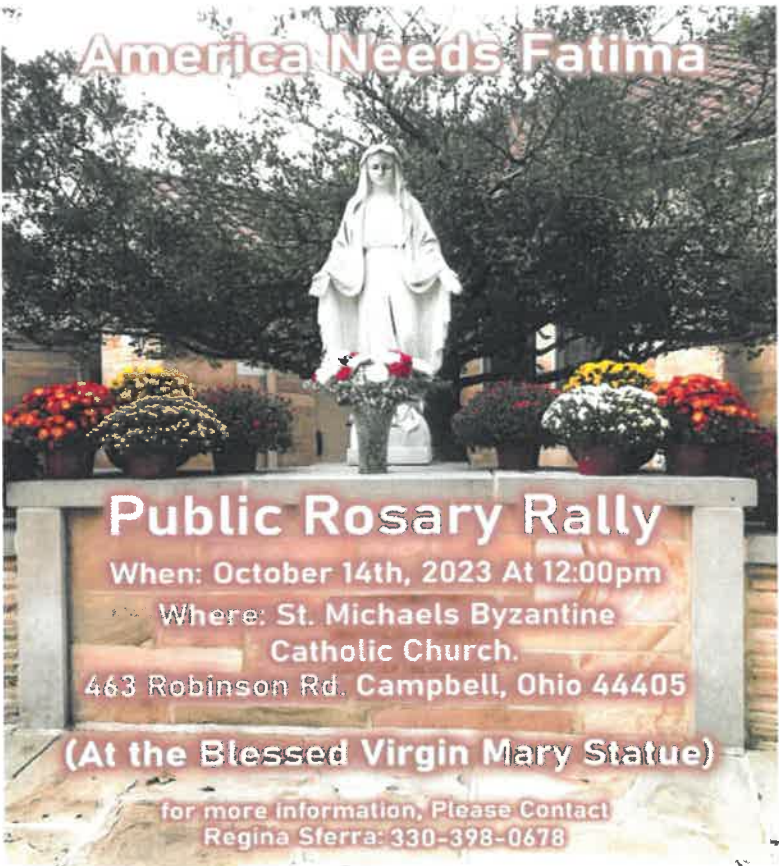
