



Celebrating Angels

This past Friday, November 8th, we commemorated our patron Archangel Michael and all the heavenly angels. The Byzantine Catholic Church believes in angels. Isn't it strange that, in our materialistic world, where many conclude that the only real things are those we experience with our five senses, they, nevertheless, are intrigued with angels?

Our Church teaches us that there is another realm of reality, just as actual, just as factual, just as substantial as anything we see, hear, touch, taste, or smell in this world. There are legions of angels "a heavenly host" helping us, for which the world has no counter-measures (c.f. Hebrews 1:14). The psalmist David referred to them as a force of thousands of thousands of chariots (Psalm 68:17). We cannot see God nor His angels with our natural eyes. But they are there, whether we see them or not.



Faith is the means by which we are able to "see" this invisible world. That is belief's true function. Faith is to the spiritual realm what the five senses are to the natural realm. Saint Paul says that faith is "the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Through faith, we recognize the existence of the spiritual world and learn to depend on the Lord for his help in our daily life. "The angel of the Lord encamps all around those who fear Him, and delivers them." (Psalm 34:7)

Yes, the Byzantine Catholic Church believes that we all have a guardian angel for as we read in Psalm 91:11 "He shall give His angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways." We must remember that whatever we do, openly or in private, we do in the presence of our guardian angel and that, on the Day of Judgement, the great hosts of the heavenly angels will be gathered around the throne of Christ, and the thoughts, words and deeds of every one of us will be a lid bare before them. May God have mercy on us and save us through the prayers of the holy Archangel Michael and all the bodiless powers of heaven!

Our 40 day spiritual journey to Bethlehem begins Friday



Beginning this **Friday**, **November 15th**, our Byzantine Catholic Church begins the 40 day spiritual journey to the cave of Bethlehem. This spiritual journey is called the **Philippian Fast or the St. Philip's Fast**, because it is immediately preceded by the feast of this apostle (November 14th). To worthily meet our Lord and Savior, we should sanctify this pre-Nativity season. Sanctifying means spending our time in faith and in the service of God and in kindness towards our neighbor, especially those who are in need of our assistance. Let us spend more time in prayer, perhaps fast or abstain a

little more than we do, and be charitable in words and deeds throughout the season of the Philip's Fast.
