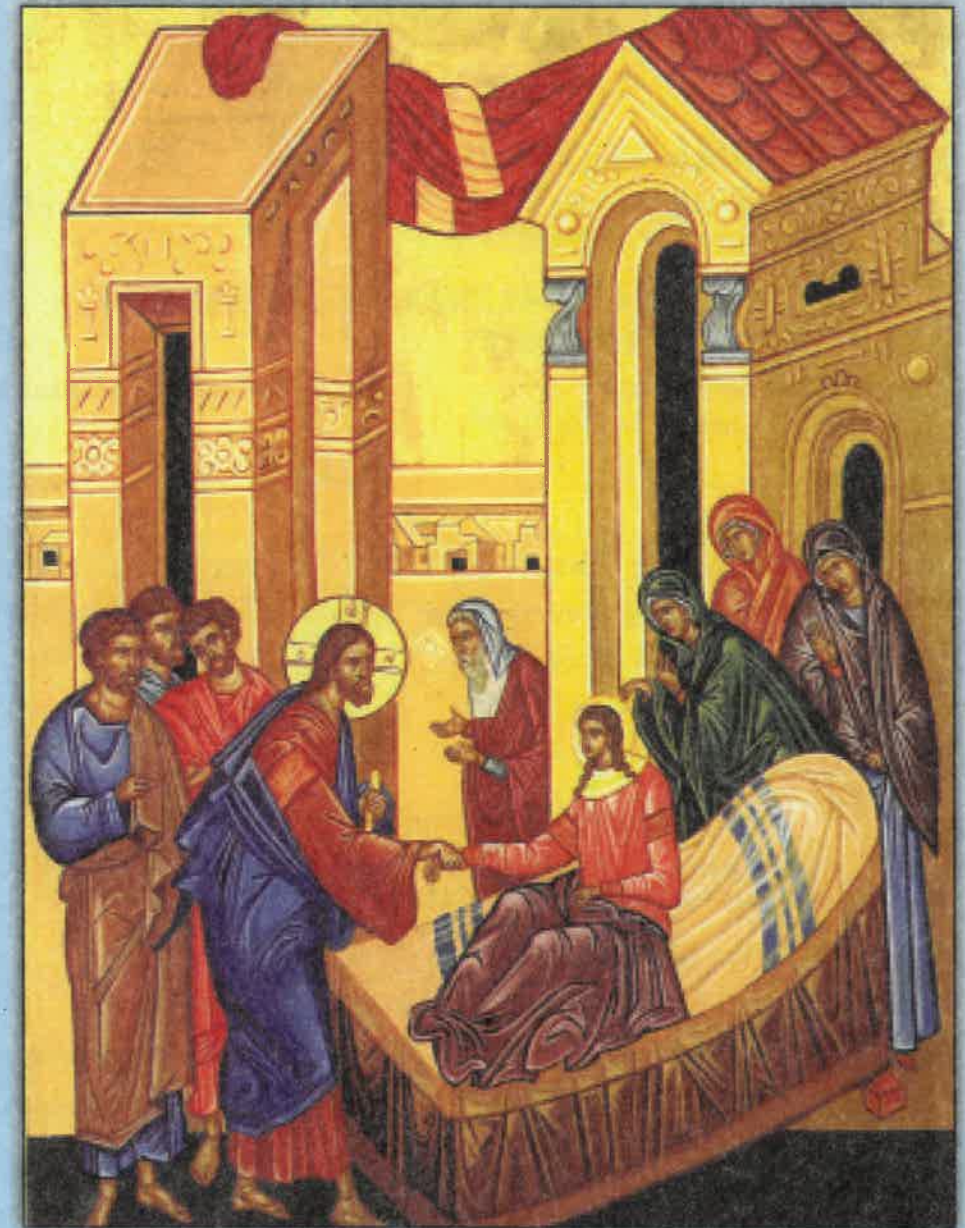
Two Miracles Attest that Jesus is the Resurrection and Life

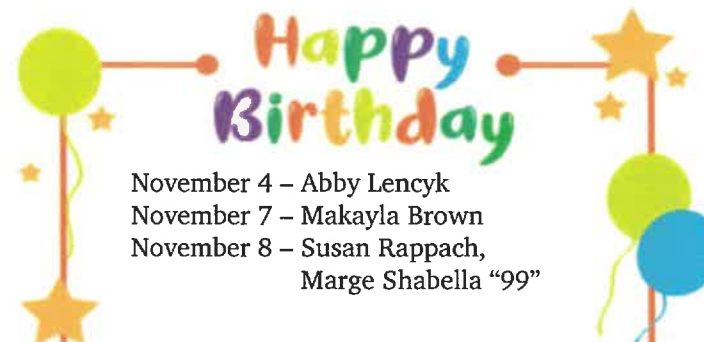

Prayers At Meal Time

It has become quite the phenomenon in our world today to see a group of people sit down to a meal together and spend almost the entire time individually distracted by their own cell phone or electronic device. Even if the meal starts out fine, if there is a lull in conversation, or if someone has that all-important work email or phone call or text message coming through, that person goes right to his or her phone, and then others follow suit.



Have you ever been to dinner at people's houses where, especially their children, spend the entirety of dinner on their cell phones. It's actually quite distracting.

How wonderful it would be if, just imagine this, people made it as strong a priority to pray before and after meals as they do to use their phones at the table. Falling into the habit of being thankful for the food that has been prepared for you, for the opportunity to gather with family and/or friends (or if eating alone, to be healthy to prepare your own food or to pray for those that prepared it), or even for the ability to see, smell, and taste the food you are about to consume would show such a strong sense of appreciation for the good things that we have in life.

Is it that people are ashamed to pray in public? Is it that people don't want to "force" their religious beliefs on someone (even if that someone is in their own family or circle of friends)? Or is it that we simply do not even think to pray when we are about to eat, or after we finish eating, or whenever any good thing is given to us?

We tend to fall back on prayer when we hear words like "cancer," "death," "heart attack," "accident," and so forth. Not that these aren't good times to pray and not that people who suffer are undeserving of prayer, but what a great thing it would be to get into the habit of praying during good times as well! What a great thing to show the world how truly Christian we are through our open willingness to pray!


If only we could make prayer as commonplace as technology in our world, how much more peaceful and simple our world would be! Let us not be ashamed of who we are and what we believe. Let us change the world, one day at a time, not by forcing ourselves onto others, but by living our lives as Christians. Let us share and show our love of our Savior and Lord without fear, without hesitation, and, most of all, without forgetting!
