Deeper Prayer

Without prayer, we cannot even hope to establish a relationship with God. Prayer is that precious gift that allows us to communicate with God. Even our Lord Jesus Christ Himself prayed! Now while Jesus had said to us that our Father in Heaven already knows what we need even before we need it, He still commanded us to ask our Father in heaven for what we need. We need to turn to God whenever we are fearful, angry, sad, lost, or even happy. Prayer is that means of sharing our life with Him – remember, God provides to the one who asks! But we can only receive what we need when we truly turn to God with all of our heart, mind, and soul. We have the gift of free will – hence, we need to freely ask God for what we need. Prayer draws us closer to God and improves our relationship not only with Him, but in fact with the rest of the world. Love of God makes love of ourselves and love of others possible. Prayer helps train us to avoid sin and purifies us in a way to be receptive of God's graces in restoring His divine image in all of us.

Our first duty, above all else, is prayer. When we pray, we offer up our love to God and communicate this love to Him, and by extension, to others. Prayer is the means to attaining a divine intimacy with God. Unfortunately, it is way too easy to find excuses for not praying. Thus, when we pray, there are a couple of things we need to have in mind, especially if we want to discern what God has planned for us. Specifically these are:

- --1. **Pray with all of your heart, mind, and soul**. It is much better obviously to humbly recite one Our Father with all of your being, with meaning and love of God, rather than reciting the Jesus Prayer 2000 times robotically and mechanically. Remember, we are trying to establish a relationship from our hearts with God, not simply go through mechanics. We are not here to pay lip service to God, but to really love Him and be intimate with Him.
- --2. Let God lead you. The ultimate goal of prayer is union with God. God sometimes might be leading you into deeper prayer, such as meditation or contemplation. Sometimes, during your daily routine, you might even be led by the spirit to spontaneously pray an Our Father or Hail Mary. Don't fight the Holy Spirit, but let Him work in your heart.
- --3. **Be sincere and humble of heart and remember who you are praying to**. Do not be like the proud Pharisee who haughtily boasted to God in his prayer that he was not like the sinful Publican, who instead did not approach near the altar and tearfully asked, "God, be merciful to me a sinner." God was angered by the Israelites of old for offering sacrifices to Him while openly sinning before Him. Remember to be humble and sincere, just as if you were to approach and dialogue with your grandparents or with a benefactor or ruler of state. Do not be proud, boastful, or wish evil on anyone. As St. Ephrem says in his prayer, to keep "my sins always before me." Be instead like the Publican and approach God with a spirit of conversion and humility.
- --4. Before any prayer, meditation, or liturgy, pause and gather yourself to remove any distractions. This is important, because in prayer, we need to wholly devote ourselves to God. This is not possible if we are thinking about the latest sports scores, shopping lists, etc., or if our cell phones are going off in church. Shut off your cell phones, put away any distractions, and clear your mind before engaging in prayer. You know how distracting and rude it is when someone is talking with you and during your conversation is idly texting away on his or her phone. It goes the same when dialoging with God in prayer!
- --5. **Set up a rule of prayer**. Think of prayer as a means of working your "spiritual muscles." Without a routine of working out, you will never achieve fitness of body. In the same way, one cannot achieve fitness of soul and develop their relationship with God unless they have a regular set practice of prayer. One suggestion is that you give yourself 5-10 minutes each day to say a prayer or read a scripture passage to yourself.
