There is Life in the Church because in the Church is the Spirit


My brothers and sisters, if you want the Holy Spirit to dwell in you, listen carefully. Our spirit, by means of which each individual lives, is called the soul. And look what the soul does in the body. It gives life to all the limbs. It sees with the eyes, hears with the ears, smells with the nose, speaks with the tongue, works with the hands, walks with the feet. It is present at one and the same time in all the limbs to make them live. It gives life to all the limbs and to each limb its function. It is not the eye that hears, not the ear that sees, not the eye or the ear that speaks. Yet they are nonetheless alive. The ear is alive, the tongue is alive. Their functions are different, the life is the same.

The Church of God is like that. By means of some believers she performs miracles, by means

of others she teaches the truth; by means of some she keeps virginity, by means of others she respects marital fidelity. The tasks are different, the life is the same. What the soul is to the body of a human being, the Holy Spirit is to the Body of Christ, the Church. The Holy Spirit does for the whole Church what the soul does for the body of the individual. Look then and see what you ought to fear and what you ought to avoid. If the body suffers an amputation (for example of a finger or a hand or a foot) does the soul go with the limb that has been cut off? While it was in the body, that limb was alive; when it is cut off it loses its life. It is like that with Christians. They are alive only while they are in the Body. If they are cut off from the Body, the Holy Spirit is no longer with them.

Pentecost meaning

On Pentecost this Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Descent of the Holy Spirit. This day is considered the birthday of the Church because, on this day, the Apostles received the gifts that would enable them to courageously proclaim God's word and God's love. As they publicly shared their faith, they met with great opposition. They were subjected to ridicule, persecution, cruel physical treatment and, in many cases, to death.

From that first Pentecost, the Holy Spirit has continually offered these same gifts to every baptized person and, throughout history, many have accepted these same gifts, trying to follow the way of Jesus. Over the years, countless people have been subjected to ridicule, persecution, cruel physical treatment and, in many cases, to death. They



are our saints, whether publicly acknowledged by the Church, or known only to a very few. We remember these, our saints, today as we celebrate the Feast of All Saints. It is only right to remember these "Holy Ones" who suffered and "gave their lives" for the Church born on Pentecost.

Our baptism calls each of us to holiness to sainthood. Through our daily joys and struggles, we can witness our belief in God who is faithful, or we can miss the many opportunities given us. Do we recognize the opportunities to witness our faith? Are we willing to risk sharing our faith and holiness?

The color GREEN for Pentecost...why?



In our Faith, we symbolize a great deal to help bring understanding of why we have gathered together to pray and how to better participate during certain feasts throughout the Life of the Church. One such way of symbolism is the use of color to recognize certain features of a feast in the Liturgical Life of our Faith. The color "green" is used during the Great Feast of Pentecost (50 days after the Resurrection of our Lord) - the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles.

The clergy vestments, altar cloths, candle holders, etc. during the Pentecostal season are green. At Pentecost, we decorate our churches with flowers and green branches, for the Church "never grows old, but is always young." It is an evergreen, ever-living Tree of grace and life, of joy and comfort. For the Holy Spirit - "the Treasury of Blessings and Giver of Life - comes and abides in us, and cleanses us from all impurity," and fills our life with meaning: faith, hope, and love.

In recognition of this, the faithful wear green as well to celebrate this Sunday. Remember, in our Church, each feast is a LIVING commemoration; it is not something that has happened in the past, but rather an event that occurs in the present in our lives. Let us dawn our green for Divine Services this weekend proudly and faithfully as we express the true living nature of our faith! What a great way to commemorate the liveliness and strength of our faith in God!

Pentecost Monday

The feast in honor of the Holy Spirit, "one of the Trinity of God, one in honor, one in essence and one in glory with the Father and the Son" is celebrated on the Monday after Pentecost. This feast has been established by the Church "for the majesty of the

Pentecost. This feast has been established by the Church "for the majesty of the Most Holy and Life-creating Spirit, for He is one of the Holy and Life-originating Trinity", in reaction to the teaching of the heretics who rejected the divinity of the Holy Spirit and that He is equal-in-honor with God the Father and the God the Son. "The Holy Spirit", as it says in the Synaxarion, "is called the Comforter because He can encourage and calm us; we received Him "in place of Christ" and through Christ we have Him; He intercedes before God for us with unspeakable sighs as the Lover of mankind, interceding for us in exactly the same way as Christ, for He is the Comforter. Therefore, the Holy Spirit is called the other Comforter; wherefore the Apostle says: we have the Comforter Jesus before God. This Holy Spirit is one with the Father and the Son in everything; He therefore accomplishes everything with Them, even the future resurrection, and everything that He wants,



He creates, sanctifies, divides, renews, sends, makes wise, anoints the prophets, and briefly to say: does everything, being all-powerful, omnipotent, good, correct, and reigning. Through him is granted every wisdom, life, activity, as He is the source of sanctification and all life. Join us for the Pentecost Monday Holyday Liturgy, June 9th at 6:00 p.m.
