And He charges the believers to be silent, for it was exclusively the task of the Apostles to preach.

The Dormition Fast begins this Friday

On August 1st, we begin a fasting season in our Church. According to tradition, the Theotokos, in preparation for her death, prayed and fasted. In imitation of her and for proper spiritual preparation for the glorious Feast of her Dormition, the Church recommends a fasting period of two weeks beginning on the first of August and ending on the Feast of the Dormition (August 15).

Days of fasting play an important part in the liturgical year. Fasting is one of the classic forms of penance and one of the great means of denying our physical impulses to focus on the spiritual. It is an abstinence that we voluntarily impose on ourselves as a way to reflect and to purposefully live our lives according to stricter standards. The Holy Scripture, both Old and New Testaments, are filled with praises of the holy practice of fasting. Fasting is a chance for us to bring renewal into our lives. It is a means through which we deny ourselves what brings us pleasure and imposes a purposeful shift on what we do and how we do it. We need to become mindful of our thoughts and actions—not only what we eat—in order to fully examine our consciences so that we may make not only a worthy confession, but also live our lives as clear examples of practicing Christians. We should focus on completely transforming ourselves in order to grow in our faith. This involves consciously changing ourselves and establishing different habits and behaviors that help us understand our faith as well as ourselves as children of God.

Read more Scripture. Attend more services. Donate more time and/or money to charities or helping those less fortunate. Refrain from exorbitant living. Live on a simple diet. These are all ways to observe the fast. And, ultimately, by denying ourselves and our own desires, we emulate the Theotokos who, in her humility and selflessness, said "Yes" to God and agreed to bear our Savior!
